HOW DOES THE CHARITY HELP?

The Connections Bus Project runs mobile drop-in youth facilities operating from double-decker buses and buildings, staffed by trained and experienced youth workers.

We aim to support young people to reach their full potential, especially those who are at risk and/or spending most of their spare time on the streets, by providing a programme of recreational, educational and personal development opportunities.

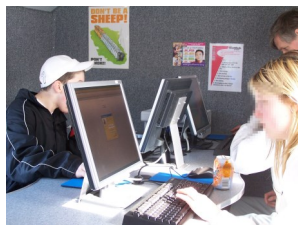
On average the charity has direct contact with over 100 young people a week.

Over 1000 young people used the buses during 2013.

Working in over 16 communities during the year.



A themed programme is presented throughout the year, with links to other organisations. Young people can also take away leaflets on many issues that affect them such as bullying, drug and alcohol awareness, smoking, eating disorders, homelessness and health.



The charity has also supported young people to start building based youth clubs in their own village with adult volunteers from the community.

For many the buses are the only youth facility that they attend or is available to them in their community.
