What is this course about?

As well as offering practical and hands-on experience, you will complete a portfolio of your work and receive a certificate on successful completion of the course, including Basic First Aid.

When	A course of 10 sessions on Tuesdays from 4 – 5.30pm Starting Tuesday 14 September 2021 Please note there will be a First Aid Course which will last for 2 hours. This will be a practical course provided by T J Training. You <u>must</u> complete the first aid course in order to obtain your certificate for the course.
Who	Open to young people aged between 14-17 (13 if you will be 14 by January 2022)
Cost	£15 per person – to include a Certified First Aid Course Some free places available – please get in touch to discuss this if payment is difficult.
Enrol	Complete the online registration form. Your place will then be confirmed and payment details supplied.
